Comments from the Editors and Reviewers:

Reviewer #1: This study examines the usage of motorcycles as a commuting mode in Yogyakarta, Indonesia, utilizing the theory of planned behavior (TPB) and structural equation modeling (SEM). While the research question is clear and the results are well-presented, I have the following suggestions and concerns:

- 1. Abstract. Consider reducing the background descriptions and including a sentence to introduce the data used in this study.
- 2. Introduction. Please elaborate on the novelty of this study. Specifically, clarify what sets it apart from existing research in this field.
- 3. Section 3. A literature review on how was TPB used in transportation behavior studies is needed. I suggest moving literature review currently in Section 5.2.1 to Section 3.
- 4. Section 4.2, Table 1. There appears to be a mismatch between Variable Manifest "P.3. Finacial capability" and Pertanyaan Pengukuran Variable Manifest P.3. "I am confident in my overall riding ability for daily trips". Please clarify or correct this inconsistency.
- 5. Section 4.3. Provide a brief paragraph explaining how SEM works and how the model's results can be interpreted, for readers who may not be familiar with the method.
- 6. Section 5.2.1. Expand the discussion of the SEM results. Highlight which findings align with previous studies, identify any novel findings, and discuss the underlying rationale for these new insights.
- 7. Section 5. Consider adding a new subsection to discuss the policy implications and practical recommendations derived from your findings.
- 8. Section 6. Please include a discussion of this study's limitations, addressing potential areas for improvement and directions for future research.

Reviewer #2: - In title: Some word is not appropriate, for instance, "motorcycle mode." Here, "mode" should be used to operate a machine.

- Lot of sentences need to be revised. The manuscript contains a loss of typographical errors.
- The abstract should provide the main results of the study.

- At the end of the introduction section, it is necessary to state briefly about the research gap and the study principle.
- Most of the figures should be replaced by better ones.
- Some fact that, in developing countries, not only the low-income, the high-income live in a far place from the city center and move to work by car.
- Some statements need a source, such as "8.35% of total..."
- In Section 3, it is better to describe each reference more clearly.
- What is "DIY" used for in the manuscript?
- In figures 5,67... why the total is not 100%?
- Some figures need to be marked with "a" and "b" labels.
- Figure 9, 10: provide Y axis unit
- In the subsection 5.2.1. The detail is duplicated in section 3. It should be included in Section 3.
- Each nomenclature should be stated once as the first appearance in the text.
- The conclusion section should contain the main findings of the study in quality.


